Gulf Coast Kid's House Accomplishments

Gulf Coast Kid's House (GCKH) experienced some major growth during the 2016-2017 fiscal year. It was an exciting year for the agency and we are grateful for the flexibility and adaptability of our staff and the dedication and generosity of our board, volunteers, and donors.

In February 2017, GCKH was awarded the contract to administer the Child Protection Team in District 1 (Escambia, Santa Rosa, Okaloosa, and Walton counties). The Child Protection Team (CPT) conducts child forensic interviews, specialized interviews with non-offending family members, medical exams, and psychosocial assessments for victims and families. The CPT staff located in the building and neighboring child advocacy centers (CACs) stayed in place, making the transition much easier. This contract acquisition added 15 CPT staff under GCKH management and approximately \$1.5 million in revenue and expenses.

GCKH Executive Director Stacey Kostevicki stated, "The Child Protection Team in this region has a rich history of solid performance and service delivery. We believe these changes will allow greater collaboration and support of CPT and ensure child victims of abuse in our region receive quality intervention."

We are also proud to report that through our continued partnership with Escambia County School District, we offered MBF Child Safety Matters™ to 18 of the 31 elementary schools in the county. The Pensacola News Journal recently highlighted our efforts, which led to new educational opportunities with the

Pensacola Public Library, Scared Heart ER Nurses and more. One reason we have made such great strides this year is that GCKH applied for, and was awarded, a VISTA position to add capacity to further support the Prevention Program. Our VISTA member, Kathleen Murdock, joined the team in November 2016 as a full-time employee subsidized through the Americorps program. Kathleen came to us with an education and teaching background and her assistance with our prevention program has been instrumental in its success. GCKH has continued to develop new curriculums to meet the growing needs in the community.

Prevention Coordinator, Paula Doty, Kathleen, and our volunteer facilitators worked hard this year and educated nearly 1,300 children and over 450 adults! Our work to reach ALL schools in Escambia County will continue and we hope to reach that goal by the end of 2017. Our strategic vision is that one day we will be able to spend more money on the prevention of child abuse than we must spend on its intervention.

As we stated – it's been a year of tremendous growth! We have no intentions of slowing down and we hope that you will continue to support us in our mission to prevent child abuse and to provide a more comprehensive and effective intervention system for children victimized by abuse.

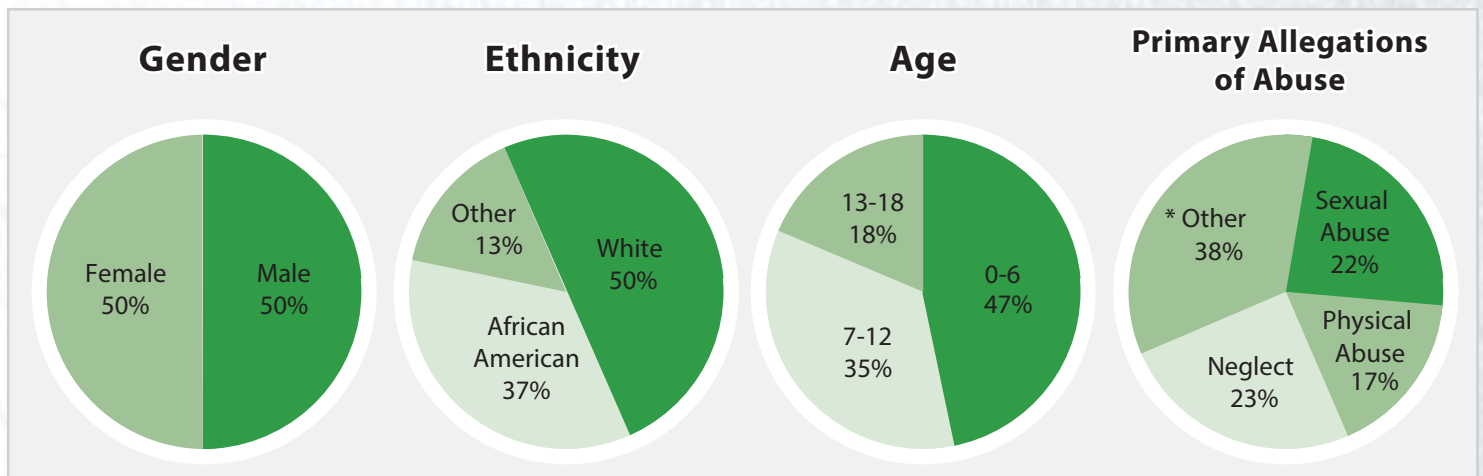

Partner Agencies Housed within GCKH

The vision of GCKH is to provide a place where child protective services, law enforcement, prosecution, medical, and mental health professionals work together under one roof to provide comprehensive services to child victims of abuse. Currently the Multidisciplinary Team (MDT) consists of:

Family and Victim Advocates:

Advocates fill a critical role of educating clients, helping them anticipate possible stressors, providing accurate, up-to-date information, and ensuring continued access to rights and services. Advocates assist families through the cycles of crisis management, problem solving, treatment stabilization, and maintenance – they are essential to continuity of care for children and families. GCKH Family Advocates, Vanessa Ritchie and Ronita Hardy, and the State Attorney's Office Victim Advocate, Vickie Scott, provide support for families year round.

Law Enforcement:

Representatives from the Escambia County Sheriff's Office and the Pensacola Police Department within GCKH investigate allegations of child abuse, collect evidence, interview suspects and witnesses, prepare arrest warrants, and attend and testify in court.

Department of Children and Families (DCF), Protective Investigators:

Jennifer Krumbein and Elise Dawson continue as DCF supervisors at GCKH. Together they supervise the two units of DCF Protective Investigators housed at GCKH. These Protective Investigators receive child abuse reports and investigate allegations of abuse.

Lutheran Services Florida:

Jessica Mayo is the LSF Supervisor at GCKH and leads a team of two additional therapists and an intern at GCKH. This team provides specialized mental health treatment for child victims, siblings and non-offending caregivers of physically and sexually abused children.

Department of Health, Child Protection Team (CPT):

Kirsten Bucey, Program Coordinator, and Dr. CiCi Sekhon, Medical Director, remain in leadership roles with the Child Protection Team. This team conducts and records forensic interviews, conducts specialized interviews with non-offending family members, and provides medical evaluations and psychosocial assessments for child victims and their families.

Office of the State Attorney (SAO):

The Office of the State Attorney Bill Eddins, located at GCKH, is fully staffed with three prosecutors, two legal assistants and a victim advocate. This year, we said goodbye to ASA Cassandra Andres and welcomed ASA Renda Cook. This office handles all cases of child sexual abuse, physical abuse and neglect, child homicides, and sexual offender registration compliance, in Escambia County. The office serves as a resource for law enforcement investigating the cases and for all agencies located at GCKH. Each abuse case is handled by the assigned prosecutor from arrest to the conclusion of prosecution in criminal court.

As the facilitating agency of our Center, GCKH has nine full-time staff members. This staff is responsible for ensuring that every family that comes to GCKH is provided advocacy services; that partner agencies are well-supported so that they can support families; and that agencies continue to work together cooperatively and effectively. GCKH provides much needed outreach and fundraising activities as well as maintains accreditation with the National Children's Alliance and the Better Business Bureau.
