Dear Friends and Supporters,

As I reflect on fiscal year 2024-2025, I am filled with gratitude for the incredible community that surrounds Gulf Coast Kid's House. This year has been marked by significant growth, meaningful partnerships, and unwavering dedication to the children and families we serve.

Excellence in Service and Accreditation

We are proud to have achieved re-accreditation through the National Children's Alliance, reaffirming our commitment to providing the highest standard of care for victims of child abuse. We also earned accreditation through the Pensacola State College Center for Nonprofit Excellence, validating our organizational strength and operational integrity. Lastly, we were re-accredited by the Better Business Bureau, highlighting our transparency in donor relations. These recognitions reflect the professionalism and dedication of our entire team.

Expanding Our Impact

A major milestone this year was bringing therapy services in-house (technically, this happened in FY25-26, but we are so excited to share it here!). Lutheran Services Florida had been the main therapy partner with GCKH since 2004. As they turn their focus to shelters for troubled and truant youth, we are thrilled to move therapy services in-house. This transition allows us to provide more seamless, coordinated care to the children we serve, ensuring they receive consistent support throughout their healing journey. We have paused our Adult Survivors Group, but will be bringing it back in 2026. We were also honored to receive a CARES grant from the Escambia County Children's Trust to support our prevention programming. This enables us to reach more families before a crisis occurs and strengthen our community's safety net through K-12 and community prevention education.

We also launched our first-ever Taste of 12th Avenue fundraiser, where supporters got a passport to experience food and drink samples along 12th Avenue. This was a fun and delicious way to support GCKH during Child Abuse Awareness Month.

While we celebrated new beginnings, we were also sad to see a chapter end. The Northeast Sertoma held its final Dragonboat Festival in support of GCKH. This beloved event brought our community together one last time, and we are grateful for the years of support and joy it provided.

This year, we mourned the loss of Penny Ruston, an incredible supporter whose generosity and compassion touched countless lives. Penny's legacy lives on in the children whose futures were changed because of her kindness. We also remember Peg McElroy, a loyal volunteer gone too soon. 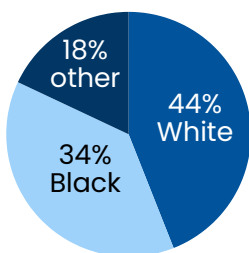

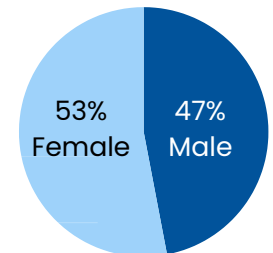

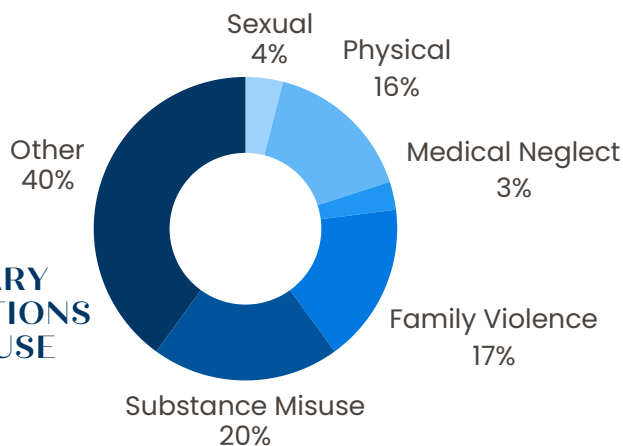

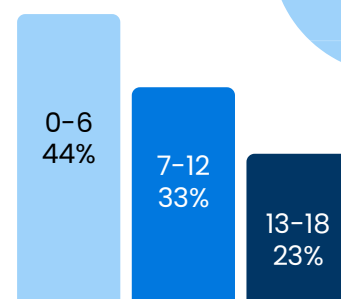
GENDER

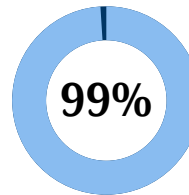

The Sexual Abuse Treatment Program provides specialized individual, group, and family therapy services to children ages 3-17 who have been victims of sexual abuse, along with critical support services for their siblings and non-offending caregivers. The program employs evidence-based treatment modalities specifically designed to address the unique trauma experienced by child sexual abuse victims. By bringing this specialized treatment program under our umbrella, we can offer even more comprehensive services to the children and families we serve, all within our child-friendly facility.

We want to express our deep gratitude to Lutheran Services Florida for their years of dedicated service to child sexual abuse victims in our community. LSF has been a trusted leader in protecting and uplifting children and families across Florida since 1982.

"Through our Sexual Abuse Treatment Program, we have provided vital healing and hope to some of the most vulnerable children in our community," said Jamilyn Newton, Regional Director at LSF.
